Lesson	Concepts	Objectives—Students will be able to:
<p><b>Introductory Lesson: Class Rules</b></p>	<p>Rules help everyone feel safe and respected.</p> <p>Feeling safe and respected helps you be a better learner.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify safe and respectful actions and words that help them follow the class rules</li> <li>• Connect following class rules with helping everyone feel the way they want to feel in class</li> </ul>
<p><b>Lesson 1: Recognizing Bullying</b></p>	<p>Bullying is mean or hurtful behavior that keeps happening. It is unfair and one-sided.</p> <p>Bullying is not safe, respectful, or kind. It is against the rules.</p> <p>Recognizing bullying is the first step in getting it to stop.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify bullying</li> <li>• Recognize bullying in response to scenarios</li> </ul>
<p><b>Lesson 2: Reporting Bullying</b></p>	<p>When you haven't been able to get mean behaviors to stop, you must tell a caring adult.</p> <p>If you practice reporting bullying, it's easier to report bullying when it really happens.</p> <p>Reporting is an assertive behavior.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify caring adults to talk to about bullying or mean behaviors</li> <li>• Differentiate between tattling and reporting</li> <li>• Demonstrate how to report bullying</li> </ul>
<p><b>Lesson 3: Refusing Bullying</b></p>	<p>You can refuse to let bullying happen to you or to others.</p> <p>Being assertive is one way to refuse bullying.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recognize bullying</li> <li>• Apply assertiveness skills to refuse bullying in response to scenarios</li> </ul>
<p><b>Lesson 4: Bystander Power</b></p>	<p>Bystanders are people who see or know about bullying happening to others.</p> <p>There are things bystanders can do to help stop bullying.</p> <p>Bystanders can also refuse to let bullying happen.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Define “bystander”</li> <li>• Demonstrate ways that bystanders can help stop bullying in response to scenarios</li> </ul>
